Re: Mississippi Public Records Act Request

Dear Public Records Officer:

Pursuant to the Mississippi Public Records Act, Miss. Code §§ 25-61-1 *et seq.*, American Oversight makes the following request for records.

Requested Records

American Oversight requests that your office produce the following records within seven working days:

1. Records sufficient to identify the names and titles of any staff members from the Office of the Attorney General who attended, virtually or in person, the Rule of Law Defense Fund (RLDF) Senior Staff Summit on or around September 23-24, 2020, in Atlanta, Georgia.

Responsive records may include, for example, attendance lists, registration or confirmation emails, calendar entries or invitations, or email communications.

2. All records reflecting the substance of and participants in any discussions, events, or sessions of the RLDF Senior Staff Summit held on or around September 23-24, 2020. Responsive records include, but are not limited to, agendas, presentations, video or audio recordings (including recordings or transcripts of meetings held on Zoom), meeting minutes or summaries (including handwritten notes and informal email summaries), meeting handouts, invitee and participant lists, and any materials exchanged by parties attending the meetings.

Please provide all responsive records from September 16, 2020, through September 30, 2020.

Please notify American Oversight of any anticipated fees or costs in excess of \$100 prior to incurring such costs or fee.



Guidance Regarding the Search & Processing of Requested Records

In connection with its request for records, American Oversight provides the following guidance regarding the scope of the records sought and the search and processing of records:

- Please search all locations and systems likely to have responsive records, regardless of format, medium, or physical characteristics.
- In conducting your search, please understand the terms “record,” “document,” and “information” in their broadest sense, to include any written, typed, recorded, graphic, printed, or audio material of any kind. We seek records of any kind, including electronic records, audiotapes, videotapes, and photographs, as well as letters, emails, facsimiles, telephone messages, voice mail messages and transcripts, notes, or minutes of any meetings, telephone conversations or discussions.
- Our request for records includes any attachments to those records or other materials enclosed with those records when they were previously transmitted. To the extent that an email is responsive to our request, our request includes all prior messages sent or received in that email chain, as well as any attachments to the email.
- Please search all relevant records or systems containing records regarding agency business. Do not exclude records regarding agency business contained in files, email accounts, or devices in the personal custody of your officials, such as personal email accounts or text messages.
- In the event some portions of the requested records are properly exempt from disclosure, please disclose any reasonably segregable non-exempt portions of the requested records. If a request is denied in whole, please state specifically why it is not reasonable to segregate portions of the record for release.
- Please take appropriate steps to ensure that records responsive to this request are not deleted by the agency before the completion of processing for this request. If records potentially responsive to this request are likely to be located on systems where they are subject to potential deletion, including on a scheduled basis, please take steps to prevent that deletion, including, as appropriate, by instituting a litigation hold on those records.

If you have any questions regarding how to construe this request for records or believe that further discussions regarding search and processing would facilitate a more efficient production of records of interest to American Oversight, please do not hesitate to contact American Oversight to discuss this request. American Oversight welcomes an opportunity to discuss its request with you before you undertake your search or incur

search or duplication costs. By working together at the outset, American Oversight and your agency can decrease the likelihood of costly and time-consuming litigation in the future.

Where possible, please provide responsive material in an electronic format by email. Alternatively, please provide responsive material in native format or in PDF format on a USB drive. Please send any responsive material being sent by mail to American Oversight, 1030 15th Street NW, Suite B255, Washington, DC 20005. If it will accelerate release of responsive records to American Oversight, please also provide responsive material on a rolling basis.

Conclusion
